The tension escalates into a heated argument where Atl harshly articulates her belief that Domingo represents a liability in her fight for survival. Though he protests and clings to the hope of their plans, Atl remains resolute, asserting the necessity of her survival over their fragile relationship. This moment of conflict takes a poignant turn as Domingo professes his love, culminating in a brief but charged kiss that encapsulates both desperation and longing.



As Atl departs into the night, leaving Domingo to grapple with the ache of separation, he is drawn back to the landfill by an instinctive connection to Cualli, a dog he had previously saved from abandonment. In a gesture reflecting his own thirst for companionship, he rescues Cualli, embodying a flicker of hope amid his loneliness.

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
